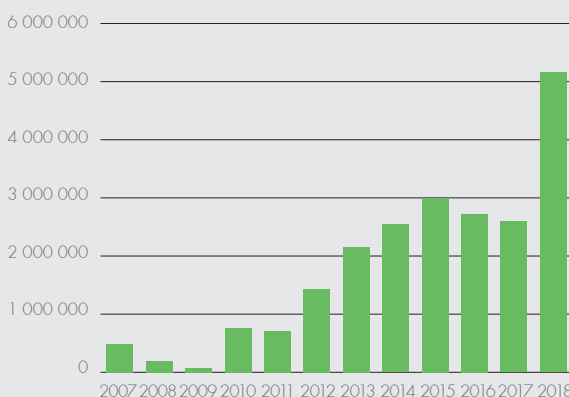

HISTORY OF PAH IN SOUTH SUDAN:

- **2006** – PAH has been implementing WASH, FSL and Emergency Shelter/NFI projects in Jonglei State since 2006. PAH began by drilling boreholes, which continues up until now in all areas of the country. In addition, PAH saw operational expansion into Uror County, Ayod, Nyirol and Akobo, Duk and Twic East Counties.
- **2010** – PAH started to develop Emergency Preparedness & Response (EP&R) capacity in WASH and ES-NFI sectors. Since 2011 PAH has been the WASH State Cluster Focal Point for Jonglei, coordinating WASH partners in order to ensure effective cooperation.
- **2014** – After the 2013 conflict outbreak, operations expanded to Unity State. In addition to EP&R activities spread across all states in South Sudan, since 2014 PAH carried out WASH and FSL related development projects in Morobo (Central Equatoria), Magwi (Eastern Equatoria) and Koch County (Unity). PAH increased activities at schools, focusing on WASH facilities, providing school learning materials, training school hygiene clubs and raising awareness on menstrual hygiene amongst teachers and girls.
- **2017** – PAH's WASH technical experts developed a locally manufactured manual drill, reducing costs of borehole drilling. This will contribute to an increase in water point construction in hard to reach areas. In addition, PAH started expanding on activities with significant mainstreaming of Protection, Education and Nutrition across all PAH projects. **Since 2006, PAH has drilled 205 boreholes, and has restored and repaired more than 850**
- **2018** – PAH was lead agency in implementing CBI (cash based interventions) within the Shelter NFI sector. Increased attention on skills training of fuel energy saving stoves, mat weaving and focusing on environmental protection. PAH improved integrated programming WASH/Nutrition, protection sensitive WASH/GBV. This has been expanded by a static presence in Northern Bahr el Ghazel state, and increased activities for recovery and development within WASH, FSL and Education.

PAH'S CURRENT ACTIVITIES INCLUDE:

- **Coordinating WASH activities** at state and county level (Strategic Advisory Group members in WASH and NFI clusters)
- **Project planning** in the sectors of WASH, NFI, FSL, Education and mainstreamed Protection and Nutrition, based on multisector needs assessments
- **Providing safe water** through manual, mechanical borehole drilling, the restoration and repair of existing water points and regular water quality monitoring
- **Supporting dignified access to adequate sanitation services** (HH, institutional, and community level) and improving hygiene practices
- **Local capacity building** through training female and male Pump Mechanics, Water User Committees and Community Hygiene Promoters
- **Provision of non-food items and emergency shelter materials** and trainings on the appropriate use
- **Improving community access to cereal foods, nutritious vegetables and fishery products** from own production and raising the capacity of targeted communities in good agronomic practices
- **Supporting Education institutions** with improved access to WASH facilities, hygiene promotion campaigns and learning materials
- **Supporting Nutrition and Health facilities** with improved WASH facilities
- **Nutrition support** for HH with malnourished children through the provision of hygiene kits, messaging, screening and referrals
- **Protection mainstreaming** across all PAH projects, conducting regular protection-related monitoring, providing reports, conducting staff training and referrals
